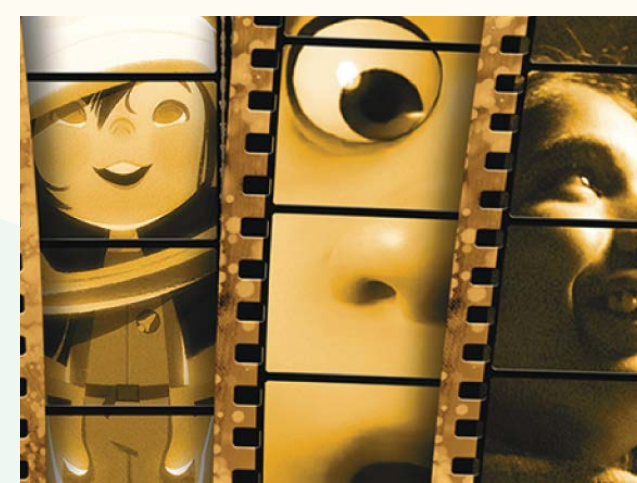


THE NIGHTINGALE | AU./USA, 2019
